Hollowell Church was formed in 1883. It was initially a group of brethren meeting at the home of Isaac Shank. In 1888, a meeting house was erected on the current site of our church.

Hollowell has continued to reach our community with the love of God and with the message of the Gospel by focusing on community, a deeper spiritual life through the study of Scripture and prayer, and through the power of the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. It is our goal to reach others, teach and obey the Word of God, and celebrate God's presence through dynamic worship.

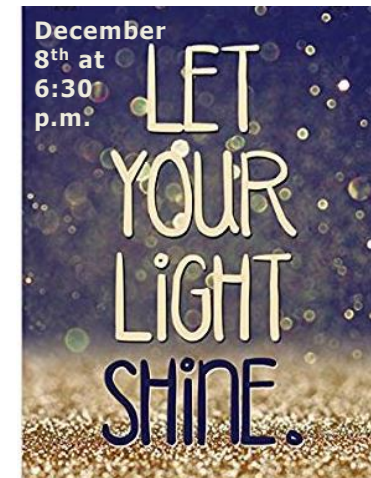


### Our current sermon series

*Christian faith goes digital! The notion of picking and choosing what informs our faith is creating challenges to our core beliefs.*



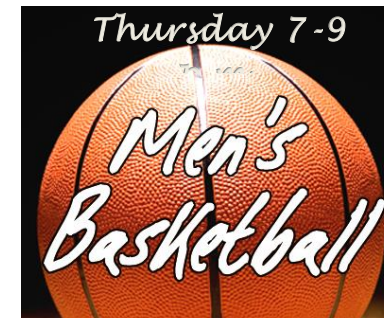
Kids Klub celebrated a Fall Fun Fest this past Wednesday night. See if you can identify these "dress up" game participants by their familial traits!
