So what can you expect to see and hear in the BIC tradition?

- An uncompromising commitment to the absolute authority and inspiration of Scripture. No organizations, citizenships, affiliations are permitted to supplant our convictions from the Bible.
- A call to follow Jesus by allowing his character to be seen in and through us. The transformation into his image is our goal. We call it, incarnational theology.
- A responsibility to protect and guard the dignity and equality of all our brothers and sisters, born or yet to be born, male or female, white or dark skinned.
- A dedication to the Great Commission, to share the Good News of Jesus with all the world, both here at home and abroad.
- A pledge to serve as the hands and feet of Jesus, to bring healing and comfort to the hurting, sick and needy of our world.

From these convictions, we derive peace-making, simplicity in lifestyle, egalitarianism, and other core values. But these are the convictions that guide our orthodoxy (what we believe) and our orthopraxis (how we behave).
